Did you know the Marston Science Library...

- Was founded in 1987
- Is named after Robert Q. Marston, the seventh president of the University of Florida
- Was originally called the Central Science Library
- Is five stories tall
- Had over 778,000 people visit in 2008
- Has been the home of Government Documents since 2003
- Has over 248,000 books and 195,529 journal volumes in its collection
- Has a view of Paynes Prairie from the fifth floor windows
- Has 10 faculty librarians on staff
- Still has six original staff members working today
- Had 1,704 students attend 84 library instruction classes in 2008-09
- Launched its Science Portal (<http://www.uflib.ufl.edu/msl/>) in 2008
- Is sometimes called the “French Fry Library” due to its proximity to the John Henry sculpture, “Alachua”
