



Recent Acquisitions

The Panama Canal Museum Collection continues to grow rapidly, primarily thanks to gifts from our amazing donors. Over the past ten months, we have received a wide variety of materials - everything from family letters and photographs to t-shirts and bumper stickers. We collected numerous items relating to Operation Just Cause, the transfer of the Canal, and treaty opposition (including the protest sign seen here). The following list includes selected gift offers accepted by our PCMC Collection Committee. Many of these new gifts are still being processed and will appear in the online collection database in upcoming weeks.



- Anti-treaty materials (bumper stickers, flyers, etc.)
- Bound volume of *The Parrakeet* school newspaper, 1946-1948
- Brochures, programs, scripts, letters, photos, and flyers relating to theatrical and musical productions
- Digital reproduction of a binder of materials relating to the Bliss Family
- Letters, certificates, and photos relating to Operation Just Cause and Manuel Noriega
- Letters, photographs, and other materials of the Bates family (1901-1915) and the O'Connor family (1939-1942)
- Miscellaneous brochures, guides, maps, etc.

- T-shirts relating to Operation Just Cause, anti-treaty, anti-Carter, etc.
- Two Colon devil masks and a figurine wearing traditional Carnival costume and mask

For more information about donating items to the PCMC, please contact John Nemmers at 352-273-2766 or jnemmers@ufl.edu. We actively collect a wide variety of materials in order to develop the PCMC, including:

- 1. Diaries, journals, memoirs, firsthand accounts, oral histories, and other types of personal narratives that offer unique perspectives and stories.
- 2. Correspondence such as letters, telegrams, and postcards.
- 3. Home movies, films, and audio or video recordings that were not produced commercially.
- 4. Photographs in all formats and types: prints, slides, negatives, aerial photos, panoramic, stereographs, etc.
- 5. Scrapbooks. However, we generally do not collect scrapbooks full of newspaper clippings. Please do not assemble archival materials into a scrapbook before donating.
- 6. Ephemera such as brochures, pamphlets, programs, menus, and travel guides. We do not collect duplicates, but we do want to collect ephemera that we have not already preserved.

For many of the objects listed above, we do accept digital reproductions if donors are not willing to donate the original objects.

If you haven't done so already, please consider joining the Friends of the Panama Canal Museum Collection at UF. The funds collected are used to support the preservation, conservation, digitization, exhibiting, and processing of the collection.
