PCMC and National History Day



The Panama Canal Museum Collection continues to be a very popular topic for middle and high school students participating in the <u>National History Day</u> program. Over the past few years, we have seen an increase in the number of students requesting information from the collection as part of their research, and this year continues that trend. In early October, we already have responded to eight students who are seeking information, photos, or other resources.

Students in grades 6-12 participate in the National History Day program worldwide by conducting historical research to produce a project either as an individual or as a group. The submitted projects can be papers, exhibits, documentaries, performances, or websites. Over half a million students participate in the first round of regional contests annually, with winners advancing to state and then to national contests. National History Day is supported by a variety of national organizations including the American Historical Association, the Society of American Archivists, and the American Association for State and Local History.

The majority of the requests received every year are from students seeking data, such as the annual revenue for the Canal, the death rates during French and American construction periods, and financial information about construction and operation of the Canal. We also receive a number of requests for interviews because the students are eager to speak to individuals who lived and worked in the Canal Zone. Some of our PCMC Friends members have participated in these interviews. In 2019, a group of students from Francis Parker School in California was awarded 2nd Place nationally for their exhibit entitled, "The Panama Canal: A Triumph Entrenched in Tragedy."

The 2019-2020 theme for National History Day is "Breaking Barriers in History."
