 - a. Beautiful window treatments created by our designers are fabricated here by very talented hands.
 - b. Also fabricated in this area are bed skirts, bedspreads and pillow covers.
- 4. Design Studio
 - a. In this area are the samples of the various materials needed to create all elements of an interior, including: fabrics, carpet, rugs, wall coverings, drapery hardware and furniture catalog library.
 - b. Here our designers bring together the various materials for each project and present this to the client with collage boards, furniture plans, sketches and in some cases, renderings.
- 5. Showroom

Within the 45,000 sq. ft. showroom, Hugo's presents to the public these custom built upholstered pieces in settings combined with fine quality furniture from top manufactures.
